






Child and Booster Seat Guide | New Zealand







Child restraints for all vehicles

All children aged under seven years must travel in an approved child restraint. An adult lap-sash seatbelt is designed for people with a minimum height of 148cm. A child should continue using a forward facing restraint or booster seat until they have outgrown it.

The type of restraint required for your child depends on their age as follows:

- · Children aged from birth to approximately four years (birth-18kg) must use a child seat
- · Children aged between four and seven years (15-36kg) must travel in an approved, properly fastened and adjusted, forward facing child seat restraint OR an approved booster seat which is properly positioned and fastened with a standard lap-sash seatbelt
- · All child restraints must comply with the standards approved in New Zealand

Hiring a child or booster seat or bringing your own

- · Child restraints are available for hire from all thI branches for NZ\$36 per hire. Child/booster seats are included in the Inclusive Pack for each brand. To ensure available stock it is recommended that child restraints are requested at time of booking.
- · An AU/NZ Standard, European Standard or American Standard restraint that complies with New Zealand law is acceptable to use in New Zealand
- · It is the responsibility of the driver to fit the seats in the vehicle

Where your child can sit

- · Front passenger seats in all vehicles cannot accommodate children under seven years, nor children who are over seven years but still in a child restraint.
- · Child or booster seats are not permitted in the rear facing seats of any vehicle
- · We recommend that children are kept rear facing until at least two years of age. If the child is older but still fits the child seat requirements it is recommended they remain rear facing.




Child Seat
